




St Mary Magdalen's RC Primary Remote Learning Survey



Thank you to everyone who has responded to our survey around the Remote Learning provision offered during the period of school closure. There were many positives and also some suggestions of how to further refine our offer.

Results showed that...

96% of children are accessing remote learning.

94% are engaged with the variety of tasks.

90.5% parents feel pupils receive the right amount of work.

90.5% feel their children receive feedback from the class teacher.

88.9% feel their child is coping well with the amount of work set.

Strengths

Areas to develop

'...I think it would be really beneficial for the reception children to have a 'social' (songs, story time) rather than a 'learning' session once a week.'

'...Vary the approach to English'

'...A greater variety of PE tasks'

We have already started to address some of these areas to improve the Remote Learning offer for our children...

...Reception have started their social sessions online using Microsoft Teams.

...New PE tasks have been shared with staff for use within the Remote Learning and sessions are planned with the School Sports Partnership once the children return to school.

We will continue to review and update the Remote Learning provision throughout the school.
